Executive Summary of Parent Survey November 2007

The parents gave an exceptionally high overall performance score (87%), while among the parents whose children were not in their first year at the school 32% said the school had improved over the last year while only 4% thought the school's performance was worse. Of the parents of new pupils, only 2% felt that the school had not lived up to their expectations while 31% said the school was better than they had expected it to be.

With regard to Non-Academic areas, parents are most happy with the delivery of Control of bullying, Developing potential and Community spirit.

The parents are least happy with the delivery of Choice of subjects, Careers advice and School facilities.

The parents' top priority for improvement is School facilities.

The following Non-Academic areas obtained significantly higher scores than the previous survey: Developing potential, Caring teachers and Computer access.

The following Non-Academic area obtained a significantly lower score than the previous survey: School meals.

Of the areas identified in the performance criteria, parents judged 12 to be outstanding and 7 good. No areas were judged to be anything less than good.
